Fire Chief's March Monthly Report

April 27, 2023

To the Honorable Fire Commissioners;

The month of February saw the BFD respond to 238 calls for service. There were 6 residential structure fires, 11 total residential structure fires (\$630,000 est. property loss), 2 vehicle fires, 87 EMS, extrication/rescue, and 35 false alarms.

Miscellaneous:

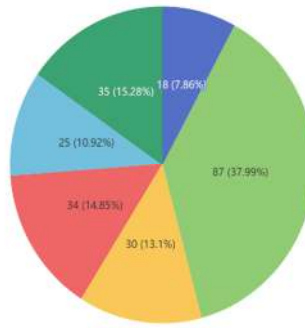
BOF transfer request of \$27,185.63 from 2022 Bunker gear account to Mechanical account was approved and transferred.
